WHAT IS CLASSICAL FENG SHUI?

Classical Feng Shui involves the study of land, buildings, time and people. There are two main schools that cover the study of land and buildings, San He / Luan Tou (Land Form) and San Yuan / Li Qi (Theory of Calculation in regards to house placement and time and commonly referred to in the west as Compass School). The study of people is covered in Ba Zi / Four Pillars and Eight House Theory. The art and science of Feng Shui has been used for thousands of years. It is a time-tested wisdom of designing the most harmonious places to live and work.

WHY STUDY FENG SHUI?

Classical Feng Shui is the study and analysis of Qi (a broad word for energy) particularly in its effects on people. Feng Shui is the study of how we can improve our homes and environments, our lives, our families and humanity in general. Feng Shui is one of the Five Arts of Chinese Metaphysics; and when used correctly is a powerful tool to improve our lives.

It has long been known in China that the buildings, cities and environments we spend time in play a role in shaping our lives and destiny. Just as we project our personality into an environment, the reverse is true as well. The longer we live in any particular place; the environment exerts its influence upon all aspects of our lives.

As above, so below', suggests that there are cosmic patterns that influence each other in an ordered way. The Chinese observed nature and time and saw that the universe had life force energy, they called this mysterious force Qi. They observed the cycles of nature and its energy transformations and found consistent patterns to this Qi. They recognized that a vital connection exists between everything in the universe, the tangible and intangible, each person and the environment. Feng Shui is the study of this Qi, the roots of Feng Shui are found in the Tao, the Tao being a central concept in Eastern culture.

Feng Shui is the study of landforms. It is in the natural environment of mountains and water that we find the source of Qi. It is mountains, hills, lakes and rivers and in our cities buildings and roads that retain, conduct, and moves Qi. By identifying the types of Qi present, we can harness positive Qi and avoid negative Qi.

Feng Shui is both subjective and objective. Feng Shui is based on sound principles and logic as well as metaphysics. While being intellectual for many Feng Shui is also spiritual, physical and subtle. Each person, place and thing has its own unique energy imprint. Feng Shui teaches you how to analyze and work with this information to improve your life.

Classical Feng Shui when used correctly is a powerful tool that harmonizes the forces of nature to promote and optimize health, relationships and prosperity.

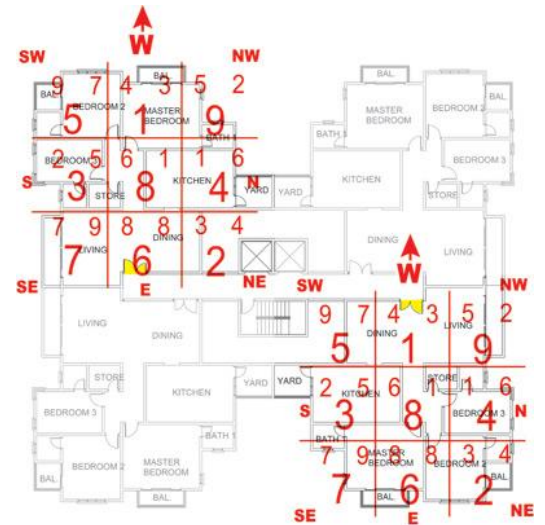
